Organization (20 pts)

The story should have a clear beginning, middle, and end. The beginning should engage the reader by presenting details about the setting and characters. The story should follow a logical sequence.

Elements of Fiction (20 points)

(5 pts) Development of characters

(5 pts) Use of dialogue

(5 pts) Development of plot (setting, climax, resolution) and consistent point-of-view

(5pts) Use of sensory details and vivid language

Grammar, Usage, Mechanics, and Spelling (10 pts)

There should be few or no errors in mechanics, grammar, or spelling. Dialogue should be formatted and punctuated correctly (Refer to GUM Unit 14 for specific lessons on how to punctuate correctly)
